Course Description

The Electronic Music course is designed to give students an introduction in creating music using Soundtrap software. Students will learn to create music, record music and sounds, create loops, and improve transcriptions through using ear training. Students will learn to create new compositions and mix various musical instruments to create exciting customized music.

Goals & Objectives

Students will use Soundtrap, a web based software, to create various musical beats, mixes, and songs. In addition students will use Noteflight and other web based software to learn how to structure melody, harmony, and rhythm. Students will be able to rest various plug and play instruments that can be used with their chromebooks.

Concepts Covered

The course is considered an introductory course for students' interested in music and/or marketing. The following concepts will be covered during the duration of this class:

- Music production & audio engineering
- Audio editing basics
- Adding & synchronizing audio sound effects
- Remixing beats & songs
- Importing, converting, & exporting different types of music sound
- Music genre introduction
- General music fundamentals and history

Grading Criteria & Rubric

The majority of assignments will be considered project oriented. All due dates will be posted in advance as well as in class. In addition, participation points will be rewarded based on classroom participation & students successfully follow classroom rules.

Students are graded on the following:

- Daily composition, learning new chromebook programs, and participation

Classwork Participation 50% (Minor Grades and more common)

Projects & Presentations 50% (Major grades, at least 3 per 9 weeks)

Missed Homework/Make-up Policy:

It is the responsibility of the student to ask for missed assignments after an absence. ALL work should be made up within a week of return.

Rules for Student Behavior:
